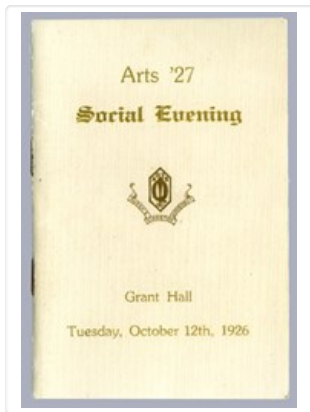


Arts '27 Social Evening [commemorative dance card]
